Camping fees are payable at the collection box adjacent to the kiosk as you enter (cash only). Payment may be made by credit with the park attendant when available or by credit or debit at the Kilby Museum Gift Shop during business hours. We do not accept cheques.

To Register:

- 1. Select an available campsite, as indicated by being unoccupied, does not have a structure on the site and is lacking a campground permit attached to the site marker post. When in doubt, check with the attendant. A site is considered occupied has been paid for; has a permit on the post and a structure (RV or Tent) on site in. Chairs are not an acceptable to leave on site as a structure.
- 2. Complete the registration form and campground permit. All information must be completed in full. The newsletter signup is optional.
- 3. Attach the campground permit to the campsite marker post at the entrance to your site.
- 4. Place completed registration form and payment (<u>cash only</u>) in the provided envelope and deposit in the collection box located at the kiosk at the entrance to the campground.
- 5. A structure (RV or Tent) must be left on site in order to complete registration. Chairs are not acceptable.

Once you have settled into your campsite stroll back along the country road to the Kilby Historic Site. Learn the interesting history of Harrison Mills; visit the friendly farm animals and the General Store Museum. We also invite you to enjoy the soup and sandwich menu of the Kilby Restaurant and browse our unique Gift Shop that carries old fashioned candy and Birchwood Dairy hard ice cream.

KILBY CAMPGROUND RULES

RESPECT THE PARK AND YOUR FELLOW CAMPERS

A campsite is occupied if it is paid for and has a structure (RV or Tent) placed on the site. <u>Check-out is at 11:00 am.</u> <u>Quiet time is from 10:00 pm to 8:30 am.</u> No music during this time.

Generator use is only permitted between the hours of 9am -11am and 6pm – 8pm. The use of "inverted generators" (i.e. Low Noise) is preferred. Generators must be placed on designated campsite pads and not in surrounding vegetation.

A maximum of four adults is allowed per campsite. One licensed vehicle plus one recreational vehicle or two tents per site maximum. All vehicles, whatever type, must be within each site's boundary.

No parking at all on the roadway ever. No tents allowed on the beach.

A camping party may arrive at the campsite with one of the following:

- a motor vehicle not designed as an accommodation for camping, e.g., car, truck, SUV, non-camperized van, motorcycle or
- a motor vehicle towing a trailer designed as an accommodation for camping, e.g., 5th wheel, travel trailer, tent trailer; or
- a recreational vehicle (RV), e.g., motor home, camper-ized truck/van; or
- a RV with a legally towed motor vehicle; or
- a motor vehicle or RV towing a trailer not designed as an accommodation for camping, e.g., utility/cargo, or boat trailer.

To a maximum of one motorcycle per each adult in the party.

With the approval of the Park Attendant a camping party may be allowed a second motor vehicle not designated as an accommodation for camping on the campsite for an additional \$10 per night.

Campground attendant must approve any change of sites during your stay

No cutting or removal of any tress, shrubs, grasses, flowers, etc. Deadwood from the Park is not to be used for firewood. Driftwood may be used if it fits into the fire pit. No bonfires. No fires on the beach. You may bring your own firewood, but take any excess firewood with you when you leave.

Pets must be cleaned up after and under your control at all times.

Fish entrails or other waste from cleaning fish are not to be disposed of in the Park or on the beach. No hunting or shooting or handling of any firearms of any sort is allowed. Crossbows, slingshots, pellet guns, paintball guns, blowpipes, etc. are prohibited within the Park. **Absolutely no fireworks of any kind. Non-compliance with these rules will result in immediate eviction from the park.**

Moving a fire pit or altering a picnic table is vandalism. Vandals will be charged and banned from the Park.

Liquor consumption is prohibited anywhere in the Park with the exception of your campsite.

No off-road or unlicensed vehicles are to be operated in or near the Park. No unlicensed drivers may operate vehicles in the Park.

Please be considerate and keep the toilets clean and make use of them as if they were those in your own home. Do not put garbage in the toilets. Please sort and recycle glass and plastic bottles, pop or beer cans at the bin provided between sites 6 and 7. Do not put garbage in the recycle bin.

Please record and report anything out of the ordinary to the Attendant and/or the RCMP. For emergencies call 911 or the Agassiz RCMP at (604) 796-2211.

The Park attendants have full discretion in all matters.

Non-compliance with any of the rules could result in legal action.

This is a private park and we reserve the right to refuse admittance.
