TO REGISTER:

1. Select an available campsite. A site is considered available when it is unoccupied, does not have a structure on the site and is lacking a campground permit attached to the site marker post. A site is considered occupied when it has been paid for, has a permit on the post and a structure (RV or Tent) on the site. Please note that sites 7-11, 18-23 and 29-34 are reservable sites only, please check with the Park Attendant/Camp Host for availability.
2. Complete the registration form and campground permit. All information must be completed in full. The names on the registration form must be the same as the occupants of the site. Identification may be required to keep the reservation valid.
3. Attach the campground permit to the campsite marker post at the entrance to your site.
4. Place the completed registration form and payment (**cash only**) in the provided envelope and deposit it in the collection box located adjacent to the kiosk at the entrance to the campground. Payment may also be made by credit or debit with the Park Attendant/Camp Host. **We do not accept cheques.**
5. A structure (RV or Tent) must be left on site in order to complete registration. **Chairs are not acceptable.**

PLEASE NOTE:

A camping party may arrive at the campsite with one of the following:

- a motor vehicle not designed as an accommodation for camping, e.g., car, truck, SUV, non-camperized van, motorcycle (to a maximum of one motorcycle per each adult in the party) or
- a motor vehicle towing a trailer designed as an accommodation for camping, e.g., 5th wheel, travel trailer, tent trailer; or
- a recreational vehicle (RV), e.g., motor home, camperized truck/van; or
- a RV with a legally towed motor vehicle; or
- a motor vehicle or RV towing a trailer not designed as an accommodation for camping, e.g., utility/cargo, or boat trailer.

With the approval of the Park Attendant/Camp Host, a camping party may be allowed a 2nd motor vehicle not designated as accommodation for camping on the campsite for an additional \$10 per night.

Once you have settled into your campsite stroll back along the country road to the Kilby Historic Site. Learn the interesting history of Harrison Mills, visit the friendly farm animals and the General Store Museum. We also invite you to enjoy our varied menu of baked goods, sandwiches, soups & daily specials at the Kilby Cafe and browse our unique Gift Shop that carries old fashioned candy and Birchwood Dairy hard ice cream.

To book a reservable site, the campground reservation line is open on Mondays and Tuesdays between 10 am and 3 pm. Please call 604-796-9576 during these times to book a site. Reservation fees apply. The reservation line will be closed on Statutory holidays.

KILBY PARK CAMPGROUND RULES

PLEASE RESPECT THE PARK AND YOUR FELLOW CAMPERS

1. Check-out is at 11:00 am. Check-in starts at 1:00 pm
2. Quiet time is from 10:00 pm to 8:30 am. No music during this time please.
3. **NEW** - The main gates will be closed from 11:00 pm to 7:00 am daily.
4. **NEW** - Generator use is only permitted between 8.30 am -10.30 am and 6 pm – 8 pm. The use of “inverted generators” (i.e. Low Noise) are preferred. Generators must be placed on designated campsite pads and not in the surrounding vegetation and beach.
5. A maximum of four adults is allowed per campsite. All children 15 years old and younger must be accompanied by an adult.
6. All vehicles and trailers, whatever type, must be within each site’s boundary. No parking at all on the roadway.
7. **No tents allowed on the beach.**
8. No cutting or removal of any trees, shrubs, grasses, flowers, etc. Deadwood from the park is not to be used for firewood. Driftwood may be used if it fits into the fire pit. **NO PROPANE OR WOOD FIRES ALLOWED ON THE BEACH.** You may bring your own firewood, but take any excess firewood with you when you leave.
9. **ALL PETS must be ON LEASH** and under your control at all times. Please clean up after your pet.
10. Moving a fire-pit or altering a picnic table is vandalism. Vandals will be charged and banned from the park.
11. Liquor consumption is prohibited anywhere in the Park with the exception of your campsite boundaries.
12. No off-road or unlicensed vehicles are to be operated in or near the Park. No unlicensed drivers may operate vehicles in the Park.
13. Fish entrails or other waste from cleaning fish are not to be disposed of in the Park or on the beach. No hunting, shooting or handling of firearms of any sort is allowed. Crossbows, slingshots, pellet guns, paintball guns, blowpipes, etc. are prohibited within the Park.
14. Absolutely **NO FIREWORKS** of any kind.
15. Please keep the toilets clean. Do not put garbage/bottle/cans in the toilets.
16. Please sort and recycle glass and plastic bottles, pop and beer cans at the bin provided between sites 6 and 7. Do not put garbage in the recycle bin. All monies raised from the proceeds of the recycled materials will be used for animal feed and care.
17. **Sites are Non-Transferrable.** A reservation cannot be transferred to another site. Reservations cannot be transferred to another person/party. Any reservation owners or holders found to be transferring or selling their reservations to another party, risk the chance that their reservation may be cancelled without a refund.
18. **NEW** - The launching of personal watercraft is prohibited at the boat launch.
19. **NEW** - Campers are responsible for all guests. Guests to exit the park by 10pm.

NOTE: Please record and report anything out of the ordinary to the Park Attendant and/or the RCMP. For emergencies call 911 or the Agassiz RCMP at (604) 796-2211. The Park attendants have full discretion in all matters. Non-compliance with any of the rules could result in eviction and/or legal action. This is a private park and we reserve the right to refuse admittance. This information is subject to change without notice.
