TO REGISTER:

1. Select an available campsite. A site is considered available when it is unoccupied, does not have a structure on the site and is lacking a campground permit attached to the site marker post. A site is considered occupied when it has been paid for, has a permit on the post and a structure (RV or Tent) on the site. Please note most sites are reservable due to the pandemic. Sites 2, 11A & 17 are first come, first serve. Please check with the Park Attendant/Camp Host for availability.
2. Complete the registration form and campground permit. All information must be completed in full. The names on the registration form must be the same as the occupants of the site. Identification will be required to keep the reservation valid.
3. Attach the campground permit to the campsite marker post at the entrance to your site.
4. Place the completed registration form and payment (**cash only**) in the provided envelope and deposit it in the collection box located adjacent to the kiosk at the entrance to the campground. Payment may also be made by credit card with the Park Attendant/Camp Host. **We do not accept cheques.**
5. A structure (RV or Tent) must be left on site in order to complete registration. **Chairs are not acceptable.**
6. To support staying local this summer, camping is limited to BC residents only – this includes both reservable sites and first-come, first-served sites.

PLEASE NOTE:

A camping party may arrive at the campsite with one of the following:

- a motor vehicle not designed as an accommodation for camping, e.g., car, truck, SUV, non-camperized van, motorcycle (to a maximum of one motorcycle per each adult in the party) or
- a motor vehicle towing a trailer designed as an accommodation for camping, e.g., 5th wheel, travel trailer, tent trailer; or
- a recreational vehicle (RV), e.g., motor home, camperized truck/van; or
- a RV with a legally towed motor vehicle; or
- a motor vehicle or RV towing a trailer not designed as an accommodation for camping, e.g., utility/cargo, or boat trailer.

Tent Policy - one tent may accompany any of the above vehicles, or if tenting only, 2 tents per site maximum. We are encouraging self-contained RV units during the pandemic. **Please note:** our washrooms do not have running water or hand sanitizer. Please use caution and carry hand sanitizer to mitigate your risk.

With the approval of the Park Attendant/Camp Host, a camping party may be allowed a 2nd motor vehicle not designated as accommodation for camping on the campsite for an additional \$10 per night.

Firewood is available for sale and Propane Fire Pits are available for rent – See the Camp Host for more information and pricing.

To book a reservable site, online reservations start at midnight on June 15, 2020 on the website campgroundbooking.com
The campground reservation phone line is open starting June 15, 2020 on Mondays and Tuesdays between 10 am and 3 pm. Please call 604-796-9576 during these times to book a site. The reservation line will be closed on statutory holidays. Additional \$5 Call Centre fee applies, as well as our regular reservation fees.

KILBY PARK CAMPGROUND RULES

PLEASE RESPECT THE PARK AND YOUR FELLOW CAMPERS, ESPECIALLY DURING THESE UNUSUAL TIMES

1. Check-out is at 11:00 am. Check-in starts at 1:00 pm
2. Please **park your RV to the right side of your site** to increase a barrier between sites for physical distancing during COVID19.
3. **Quiet time is from 10:00 pm to 8:30 am.** Excessive noise is not permitted. Please remember that sound travels further in open air, especially music and loud talking.
4. The main gates may be closed during the day and/or night for the safety and security of our campers.
5. Generator use is only permitted between 8.30 am-10.30 am and 6 pm-8 pm. The use of “inverted generators” (i.e. Low Noise) are preferred. Generators must be placed on designated campsite pads and not in the surrounding vegetation and beach.
6. A maximum of four adults is allowed per campsite. All children 15 years old and younger must be accompanied by an adult.
7. All vehicles and trailers, whatever type, must be within each site’s boundary. No parking at all on the roadway.
8. **NO TENTS ALLOWED ON THE BEACH.**
9. No cutting or removal of any trees, shrubs, grasses, flowers, etc. Deadwood from the park is not to be used for firewood. Driftwood may be used if it fits into the fire pit. **NO PROPANE OR WOOD FIRES ALLOWED ON THE BEACH.** You may bring your own firewood, but please take any excess firewood with you when you leave. **CLEAN WOOD ONLY, NO PALLETS OR CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS.**
10. **NO BBQ’S ALLOWED ON THE BEACH.**
11. **ALL PETS must be ON LEASH** and under your control at all times. Please clean up after your pet.
12. Please do not move fire pits or picnic tables without the permission of the Camp Host/Park Attendant.
13. Liquor consumption is prohibited anywhere in the Park, including the beach, with the exception of your campsite boundaries.
14. No off-road or unlicensed vehicles are to be operated in or near the Park. No unlicensed drivers may operate vehicles in the Park.
15. Fish entrails or other waste from cleaning fish are not to be disposed of in the Park or on the beach. No hunting, shooting or handling of firearms of any sort is allowed. Crossbows, slingshots, pellet guns, paintball guns, blowpipes, etc. are prohibited.
16. Absolutely **NO FIREWORKS** of any kind.
17. Please keep the toilets clean. Do not put garbage/bottle/cans in the toilets.
18. Please sort and recycle glass and plastic bottles, pop and beer cans at the bin provided between sites 6 and 7. Do not put garbage in the recycle bin. All monies raised from the proceeds of the recycled materials will be used for animal feed and care.
19. **Sites are Non-Transferrable.** A reservation cannot be transferred to another site. Reservations cannot be transferred to another person/party. Any reservation owners or holders found to be transferring or selling their reservations to another party, risk the chance that their reservation may be cancelled without a refund.
20. **NEW** If you have a boat, campers will be charged once to launch their boat during your stay. Your trailer must be parked on your campsite.
21. The launching of personal watercraft is prohibited at the boat launch.
22. During the pandemic only registered campers are allowed at your campsite. No guests are allowed (even if they are part of your ‘bubble’). These are temporary measures set out by the Province for tracing possible outbreaks.
23. Vandals will be charged and banned from the Park.

Please record and report anything out of the ordinary to the Camp Host/Park Attendant and/or the RCMP. For emergencies call 911 or the Agassiz RCMP at (604) 796-2211. The Camp Host/Park Attendants have full discretion in all matters. Non-compliance with any of the rules could result in eviction and/or legal action. This is a private park and we reserve the right to refuse admittance. This information is subject to change without notice.
