The Kilby Historic Site is seeking a creative person who is curious about BC history and is comfortable working with adults and children. The Kilby Historic Site is a designated provincial historic site operated by a charitable non-profit society in rural BC.

This 8-week summer job offers many opportunities to learn cross discipline skills.
July 2nd to August 27th, 2026

Duties include:

- Welcoming visitors to an original historic General Store.
- Having conversations and sharing stories with visitors about the history of Harrison Mills, BC.
- Delivering public programs including roaming interpretations and hands-on demonstrations.
- Attending to site opening and closing routines, and security of museum artifacts.
- Weekend work is required.

What you will experience:

- Have the most memorable job ever and learn how to make butter, ice cream, and so much more!
- Wear supplied historic clothes and look good in them.
- Learn about BC history and discover engaging ways to share it.

Requirements include:

- Under the Guidelines of this program to be eligible: you must be between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of the employment; be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act 2; and, be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations.
- Demonstrated public speaking experience. Theatre or drama experience a strong asset.
- Ability to work as part of a team.
- Ability to work 35 hours a week including weekends.
- Driver's license not required but must possess a reliable means of transportation to/from work.
- Priority may be given to applications from our surrounding towns and First Nations communities
- Must be able to pass a Criminal Record check – Vulnerable Sector.

This position offers an hourly rate of \$19.00 depending on experience.
