Do you love animals and working outside? Join our team and have the best summer job experience ever!
The Kilby Historic Site is seeking someone who is enthusiastic about farm animals, gardening, and sharing their knowledge with summer visitors in a fun and interactive way!
This **8-week**, outdoor summer job offers opportunities to learn many skills.
July 2nd to August 27th, 2026

Duties include:

- Working alongside a team lead, tend to the daily feeding and care of farm animals.
- Performing barn chores using working artifacts and historical methods.
- Wearing and maintaining a supplied historic costume when onsite.
- Maintaining a small heritage garden – manage weeds, cull and thin vegetables, water plants.
- Assisting in daily demonstrations including making butter and ice cream, and rope making.
- Attending weekly staff meetings and summer student training.
- Performing other related duties.

Requirements include:

- Under the Guidelines of this program to be eligible, **you must be between 15 and 30 years of age** at the start of the employment; be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act 2; and, be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations.
- Experience with animals and gardening an asset but a not requirement. Training is provided
- Ability to work co-operatively, as part of a team.
- Demonstrated public speaking experience, or comfort in speaking with adults and youth
- Ability to work 35 hours a week including weekends.
- Ability to lift 25 – 50 lbs.
- Driver's license not required but must possess a reliable means of transportation to/from work.
- Priority may be given to applications from our surrounding towns and First Nations communities.
- Must be able to pass a Criminal Record check – Vulnerable Sector.
